


End Stage Renal Disease Quality Reporting System

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EQRS Data Reporting Update

On January 29, 2021, the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) suspended Clinical Data, In-Center Hemodialysis Consumer Assessment of Healthcare Providers and Systems (ICH CAHPS) Attestation, and Clinical Depression Screening and Follow-Up Plan submissions in the End-Stage Renal Disease (ESRD) Quality Reporting System (EQRS).

All EQRS users must continue to follow the data suspension guidelines outlined via the January 29, 2021 EQRS Announcement (Accessible via: <u>https://mycrownweb.org/2021/01/eqrs-system-announcement-jan-2021/</u>).

KCER Overview

The ESRD Outreach, Communication, and Training (EOCT) team was pleased to have the Kidney Community Emergency Response (KCER) team participate in the March 2021 Town Hall event. During this session, the KCER team helped to highlight how KCER uses EQRS data to support the ESRD community by:

- Coordinating continuing care and access to the services for dialysis patients during emergencies or disasters
- Providing technical assistance to ESRD Networks, kidney organizations, and other groups
- Ensuing timely and efficient disaster preparedness, response, and recovery for the kidney community
- Incorporating the patient's voice in all activities, specifically within the emergency community as a whole
- Maintaining active and engaged Emergency Response Groups

Up-to-date patient information is extremely important, and facilities should keep addresses, phone numbers, and modality current, as these will be among the first items needed when relocating a patient to another facility for treatment.

EQRS Data: Supporting the ESRD NCC



EQRS data reporting assists CMS and the ESRD National Coordinating Center (NCC) with capturing data that is used to support ESRD Networks, facilities, and patients. For example, the ESRD NCC uses the mailing address and CMS-2728 data entered into EQRS to produce and distribute a New ESRD Patient Orientation Packet (NEPOP). This packet is used to help educate new patients on their treatment options.
